Plague is a flea-transmitted infection of rodents caused by *Yersinia pestis*. Fleas incidentally transmit the infection to humans and other susceptible mammalian hosts. Percutaneous inoculation of the plague bacillus in humans typically initiates inflammation of lymph nodes draining the inoculation site, resulting in bubonic plague.
